

## OFFICERS OF THE SENATE

### Continue in Office Until Replaced:

The officers of the Senate continue in their positions until their successors are appointed by the Senate, unless otherwise provided or specified.<sup>1</sup> In the revision of the rules in 1884, a proposal by the Committee on Rules as a standing rule for the election of the officers of the Senate was rejected; <sup>2</sup> it is now done by resolution.

### Election of Officers:

A majority, and not a plurality, vote is required to elect a President pro tempore and other officers of the Senate.<sup>3</sup>

The Secretary of the Senate is not elected by ballot, but by a resolution or order of the Senate.<sup>4</sup>

### Gratuity Payments Upon Death of Employees:

In the 83d Congress, First Session, the Committee on Rules and Administration adopted a policy fixing a graduated scale of gratuity payments in connection with deaths of employees of the Senate.<sup>5</sup>

### Oath of Officers:

Certain officers are not required to take the oath in the presence of the Senate.<sup>6</sup>

## OFFICIAL REPORTERS—READ BACK TRANSCRIPT

Official reporters may be ordered to read back Senate proceedings in order to support the position of the Chair.<sup>1</sup>
