TITLES OF BILLS AND RESOLUTIONS

The title of a bill or resolution is for identification purposes more than anything else, according to a ruling in the House, and the validity of a bill is not affected if an amendment made to the text is not included in the title.¹ An amendment to the title of a bill or resolution is not in order until after the passage of the bill or resolution.²

A substitute proposed for a title of a legislative bill is not required to be germane thereto.³
